#### THE MINISTER

NAMIBIAN COMPARATIVE STUDY TO DEPARTMENT OF COOPERATIVE GOVERNANCE, PRETORIA ON 19 TO 22 MAY 2015

#### 1. PURPOSE

1.1 The purpose of this report is to provide feedback from the South African delegation who participated in the Namibian Comparative Study Tour (CST) held in South Africa from 19 to 22 May 2015.

### 2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1 The National Disaster Management Centre (NDMC) organised the study tour on behalf of the Department of Cooperative Governance (DCoG) following a formal request to the Minister of Cooperative Governance and Traditional Affairs (COGTA) by the Minister of Regional and Local Government, Housing and Rural Development of Namibia. The purpose of the CST was to afford the Namibian delegation an opportunity to learn about emergency and disaster management issues in South Africa.
- 2.2 The CST was precipitated by the fact that Namibia is in the process of developing its emergency management policy that is meant to provide guidelines for effective and timely response to emergencies within the local authorities. This policy seeks to further provide a clear understanding of roles and responsibilities of the various role players, as well as the introduction of appropriate interventions to save lives, property and the environment.

### 3. DISCUSSION

- 3.1 The Namibian delegation comprised eight representatives, who arrived in South Africa on Monday, 18 May 2015. They were received and transported by the NDMC's official bus to their accommodation facility which was in Centurion.
- 3.2 The NDMC hosted the CST from 19-22 May 2015 with the assistance and support of key sector departments who are involved in emergency and disaster management issues within the South African environment (see Annexure A for programme of 19 May 2015).
- 3.3 The selection of sector departments was also informed by the areas of interest identified by Namibia for the CST which included amongst others, the structural arrangement of the sector within the department, the roles and responsibilities of stakeholders within the sector, policy and legislative frameworks, and funding model to name but a few.
- 3.4 While the engagements with key sector departments focused primarily on policy and regulatory activities, several municipalities were identified to share the operational strategies they have to manage emergencies and disasters.
- 3.5 The Namibian delegation for the CST comprised senior government representatives as outlined below:

- 3.6 The team also received support from the Communications unit of the Department.
- 3.7 Detailed information on the activities that were undertaken during the CST by the visiting delegation from 19 to 22 May 2015 is attached as **Annexure B**.
- 3.8 At the end of the CST, representatives of both countries (South Africa and Namibia) agreed that institutional mechanisms such as a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) must be considered to enhance bilateral cooperation between the two countries on disaster and emergency management issues.
- 3.9 It is important to note that this CST was successful because of cooperation of all identified role players (sector departments, municipalities, civil society organisations and private sector institutions) led by the NDMC.
- 3.10 The active participation of the Executive Mayor of the Mopani District Municipality, Ms N Rakgwale, during the visit to her District's Disaster Management Centre greatly enhanced the CST (see Annexure C). In view of this, a letter (attached as Annexure D) appreciating her support has been prepared for consideration and signature by the Minister. The Head of the NDMC has already signed letters to other organisations that assisted the Department in hosting a successful CST.
